Hurricane Ian State of Emergency

As we prepare for Hurricane Ian to make local impact tomorrow, the Village of Marvin wanted to share some important information with residents.

As of late this afternoon, Union County declared a State of Emergency due to imminent threat of conditions that could cause widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property. Shortly thereafter, Mayor Pollino consented to add Marvin into the Union County State of Emergency. This declaration allows Union County Sheriff Department to restrict access along roads/areas deemed to be unsafe. While we encourage residents to stay home, please understand areas/access to specific roads could impact any travel.

Download the ReadyNC App on your phones to get up to date information, preparedness checklist, road closures, and other pertinent information.

Rain/Wind Conditions: Residents should be prepared for 39-75mph sustained winds and heavy rain fall (4-6 inches). Be prepared for flash flooding from sustained rain throughout the day. Please encourage any young drivers to be cognizant to the risks of flash floods. Remember the phrase...Turn Around, Don't Drown!

Report Damage: Residents that withstand or witness life threatening emergencies, please call 911. For Power outages, please contact your utility provider. To report down trees or blocked intersections or other non-emergency issues, please call the Village at 704-843-1680 or email Manager@marvinnc.gov

Post-Storm Debris clean-ups: Active Waste is on standby for yard debris clean up in the event the storm produces conditions that cause households to generate storm debris above the normal allowed collection maximums. Village staff will assess conditions after the storm and release more information regarding this service if needed; please wait for the Village to release information or call us if you have any questions.
